## Speaker

### Nolan Lushington

During the past 36 years, Nolan Lushington has worked with over 200 libraries as a library consultant. He has been

chairman of the American Library Association Buildings and Equipment section and a juror on the joint ALA/ American Institute of Architects Building Awards Program. Mr. Lushington was a Council on Library Resources Fellow and, with Anthony Tappe, he has taught the summer workshop in Public Library Design at the Harvard University Graduate School of Design for the past 19 years. For over two decades Mr. Lushington was the Director of the Greenwich Public Library in Connecticut, and for 11 years he was associate professor for the Information and Library Science Department of Southern Connecticut State University. He is married to Louise Blalock, Chief Librarian of the Year at Hartford Public Library and 2001 Library Journal Librarian of the Year. Mr. Lushington wrote *Libraries Designed for Users: A 21<sup>st</sup> Century Guide* (Neal-Schuman, 2002), a book first published in 1979 and in print for 20 years. *Libraries Designed for Kids*, his fourth book, was released in 2008. Louise and Nolan have 7 children and 11 grand children.
